- WHEREAS, the Cycling Club has already purchased a \$1,000,000.00, one time, race insurance policy for this event, therefore:



- WHEREAS, permission to speak in the legislative forum should be achieved through a senator's permission; therefore:

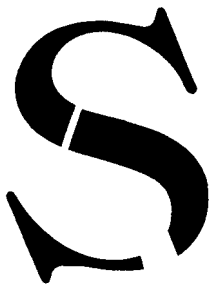

## Bill #85 Student Association Budget

- WHEREAS, the Student Association Budget Council and the Student Association Senate of the 29th Legislative Session have completed the budgetary and appeals processes to formulate the budget allocations for the fiscal year 1994-95; and
- WHEREAS, a bill for the acceptance of the total allocations which the Senate of the 29th Legislative Session has recommended must be passed in the form of a bottom line net allocation figure; and
- WHEREAS, in order to support this net allocation figure a minimal increase of \$1.50 per semester will be required bringing the total SA fee to \$132.00 per academic year (\$66.00 per semester) for undergraduate full-time students; and
- WHEREAS, in concurrence with Bill #19 of the 29th Legislative Session, part-time undergraduate and graduate students now pay an SA fee; and
- WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Legislative Branch of the Student Association to pass an appropriations level for the next fiscal year; therefore:

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York College at Oswego that the appropriations for fiscal year 1994-95 be as follows:

Total Appropriations	\$1,100,452.45
<u>Income from Organizations</u>	<u>153,050.00</u>
Net Appropriation	\$ 947,402.45

Be it further enacted that the fee for the academic year 1994-95 be set at \$66.00 per semester for full-time undergraduate students, part-time undergraduate students will pay \$4.40 per credit hour, undergraduate students taking 12 credits or over will pay \$66.00 and graduate students will pay \$4.40 per credit hour not to exceed \$66.00.
