Bill I

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

- I. That students receiving traffic violations on campus be given the right to appeal said violation before payment.
- II. Students applying for hearings must do so within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving the violation or automatically forfeit the right to a hearing and be required to pay the fine.
- III. Upon receiving notice, which students must apply for in writing, the Student Traffic Court will notify the Campus Safety Patrol of the said hearing and as to its pending date.
- IV. Students who are found guilty to violations will be required to pay the fine on the night of the hearing.
- V. If found guilty, a student will be required to pay a service charge of \$.25.

Introduced by Kenneth Rempell

AN ACT

To establish an Ombudsman

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Senate of the Student Association
of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

I. Purpose

- A. The Ombudsman will be the focal point on campus for complaints, questions and criticisms.
- B. To increase communications between organizations and individuals on the Oswego campus.

II. Appointment

- A. The Ombudsman will be appointed by the Vice President of the Student Association with the majority approval of the Senate.

III. Powers and Duties

- A. To deal with and discuss and investigate complaints and criticisms that are brought to his attention.
- B. To make available his/her phone number to all organizations and individual students of S.U.C.O.

Bill 3

AN ACT

TO ESTABLISH A SENATE-CLUB CO-OP COMMITTEE

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

I. Appointments

- A. Members of this committee shall be appointed by the Vice-President of the Student Association with the majority approval of the Senate.

II. Membership

- A. All members of this committee shall be senators.
- B. Membership of this committee is not to exceed five members or to be less than three members.

III. Powers and Duties

- A. To operate a co-op organization to buy and handle all communications materials, i.e. Ditto paper, ditto masters, poster board for all clubs and student organizations on campus.
- B. To operate on a floating budget of To purchase the materials, subject to revision each year.
- C. To charge only the price paid for such materials.
- D. To be empowered to establish its own procedures for distribution and payment.

Bill 4

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

- I. That students receiving traffic violations on campus be given the right to appeal said violation before payment.
- II. Students applying for hearings must do so within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving the violation or automatically forfeit the right to a hearing and be required to pay the fine.
- III. Upon receiving notice, which students must apply for in writing, the Student Traffic Board will notify the Campus Safety Patrol of the said hearing and as to its date.
- IV. Students who are found guilty to violations will be required to pay the fine on the night of the hearing.
- V. Students who fail to appear at the time of their hearing will forfeit their right to appeal.
- VI. Students who cannot appear at the time of their hearing must notify the Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, in charge of Traffic Court, at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the hearing.
- VII. A charge of \$.25 service to those students who are found guilty at their hearing will be collected.

Bill 6

To establish the basis upon which student fees shall be collected for the 1968-1969 academic year. To revoke section 11 A, B and C of Bill 66 of the third legislative session of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego, and to establish finance policy appropriate and necessary to the establishment of sound fiscal policy.

Be it enacted of the Student Association of the State University College at Oswego:

- I. Having reviewed the results of the referendum on mandatory student fees, the Senate takes the following action:
 - A. A Mandatory Student Activity Fee of 27 dollars per student per semester shall be assessed.
 - B. Student Teachers shall receive refunds upon request as follows:
 1. Refunds of \$13.50 (thirteen dollars and fifty cents) shall be granted upon request to those Student Teachers who teach for one quarter.
 2. Refunds of \$27.00 (twenty-seven dollars) shall be granted to those Student Teachers who teach one full semester.
 - C. Faculty and graduate students may pay this fee on a voluntary basis.
- II. Having reviewed the Student Association fiscal status, the Senate takes the following action:
 - A. That no recognizes, financed organization supported by the Student Association funds (i.e. Activities fee) shall make contract commitments without the approval of the Department of Finance. Approval shall be made solely on the basis of the financial capability of the submitting organization to meet such a commitment.
- III. Budget Council shall be empowered to establish policy necessary to carry out the policies of this bill.

Bill 7

AN ACT

To grant the HUB of M those funds not spent from their budget and to establish the procedures for the use of such funds.

Be it enacted of the Student Association of the State University College at Oswego:

Having reviewed the financial situation of the HUB of M, the Senate takes the following action:

1. Grants to the HUB of M all funds remaining in its budget at the close of the 1967-1968 fiscal year for use during the 1968-1969 fiscal year, with the following stipulations:

- A. These funds remain in the Student Association accounts until they are withdrawn according to proper procedure.
- B. That these funds only be withdrawn to pay for commitments which are open free of charge to all students who have paid for their 1967-1968 student fee regardless of whether or not they have purchased a HUB of M activities fee card.
- C. That these procedures not be deemed as a financial connection between the Student Association and the HUB of M but, rather, a guarantee that the student funds will be put to proper use.
- D. All such funds be withdrawn before the close of the 1968-1969 fiscal year. All funds remaining at that time shall revert back to the Student Association Surplus.

Bill 8

To transfer funds from the Student Association Surplus to the account of Symphonic Choir.

Be it enacted of the Student Association of the State University College at Oswego:

I. That \$750.00 be transferred from the Student Association Surplus to the account of the Symphonic Choir in order to provide funds for activities contracted over the allotment of 1967-68 for said organization.

II. That in accordance with the Budget Council's policies on deficit spending, the Symphonic Choir be penalized at the rate of 15% per year until the account is cleared.

Bill 9

To establish the means of supplementing the income of the Student Association, with funds other than those collected from the student body.

Be it enacted of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

That the Treasurer of the Student Association be granted authorization to authorize, when the state of finance is amenable, the allocation of funds for Certificate of Deposit.

1. The office of the Faculty-Student Association shall be designated as "agent" for such financial transactions.
2. That the interest accrued by such transactions be credited to the total surplus of the Student Association.

Bill 10

An Act

To establish a Senate Committee on Committees.

Be it enacted that a Senate Committee on Committees shall be formed, consisting of not less than four nor more than six members. Its duties shall be:

1. To appoint members to all Senate-formed or Senate coordinated committees.
2. To review, and recommend action to the Senate upon, all executive appointments.

The temporary chairman of said committee shall be Senator Richard Becker, who shall be responsible for choosing the rest of the committee which shall then elect its actual chairman.

To establish and maintain an on-campus, student operated radio station, WOCR.

That the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) be allocated to the use of the radio station, in addition to the \$4,000.00 included in the 68-69 Budget previously approved by the Senate.

Bill 13

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

I. That students receiving traffic violations on campus be given the right to appeal said violation before payment.

II. Students applying for hearings must do so within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving the violation or automatically forfeit the right to a hearing and be required to pay the fine.

III. Upon receiving notice, which students must apply for in writing, the Student Traffic Board will notify the Campus Safety Patrol of the said hearing and as to its pending date.

IV. Students who are found guilty to violations will be required to pay the fine within forty-eight (48) hours after notification of the court's decision, at the Faculty-Student Association Office. The time limit will not include Saturdays, Sundays or holidays.

V. Students who fail to appear at the time of their hearing will forfeit their right to appeal. Students who cannot appear at the time of their hearing must notify, within twenty-four (24) hours, the Associate Justice of the Supreme Court in charge of Traffic Court prior to their court hearing.
