AN ACT

TO ESTABLISH A POLICY FOR VISITING HOURS IN COLLEGE RESIDENCE HALLS

BE it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York at Oswego:

I. Time Of Occurrence

A. Visiting hours shall be permitted in college residence halls during the regular academic year, and during any summer in which classes are in session.

B. The hours during which visitation may occur shall be between 2 P.M. and curfew, Monday through Thursday, and between 2 P.M. Friday and curfew Sunday night.

II. Responsibilities

A. The primary responsibility for the supervision and administration of the visiting hours shall rest with the individual student and the Inter Dorm Council

B. It is the responsibility of the individual student to insure that an atmosphere conducive to study be maintained and that the rights of those students not participating in visitation be protected.

C. Each resident has the right and should assume the responsibility for asking others to maintain order and quiet. Abuses should be brought to the attention of the resident assistant on duty and/or members of the residence hall judicial boards.

D. At least one resident assistant shall be in the residence hall during the time visiting hours have been scheduled. The resident assistant will provide assistance and support where difficult situations arise and in the event of an emergency. He or she is not expected to fulfill the responsibilities defined herein as the students.

III. Violations

A. Violations shall be dealt with by the residence hall judicial boards, or where no such boards exist, by the Student Association Supreme Court.

B. Penalties for violations shall be determined by these boards or by the Supreme Court, whichever has jurisdiction.

C. The Supreme Court shall have the power to remove the privilege for a specified period of time from any floor or residence hall found to be guilty of habitual violations.

IV. Initiation Of The Policy

A. This policy shall be initiated within two weeks after ratification by the Student Association.

To Establish Discretionary Curfew for Sophomore Women.

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

Whereas the present curfew system is available only to juniors and seniors, and

Whereas sophomore women in every othe aspect of college living are considered to be upperclassmen,

Be it enacted the sophomore women be granted the privilege of discretionary curfew.

The following provisions will apply:

1. Sophomore women will be required to follow all regulations and rules now governing the discretionary curfew system.
2. The right to use this discretionary curfew will be effective at the beginning of Spring semester 1969.

Be it enacted of the Student Senate of the State University College at Oswego:

1. That a no curfew privilege be extended to all Sophomore, Junior and Senior women.
2. That a discretionary curfew privilege be extended to the women of the Freshman class.

In the event that any women student has not attained the age of eighteen (18) years, she must receive parental permission to participate in the discretionary or no curfew policy.

Presentation of Appointments

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

I. Presentation to the Senate

At such time as the President of the Student Association, Vice-President of the Student Association, or any executive officer shall present to the Senate his appointments to committees requiring student representation, the names of the appointments and their respective positions shall first be presented to the President of the Senate.

II. Voting on Appointments

Such appointments shall be presented to the Senate for its vote at the first regular or special meeting of the Senate following said presentation, and the vote of the Senate as to whether the appointments will be approved shall be as follows:

- A. There shall be a roll call vote on each appointment of the Student Association.
- B. Debate on appointments shall be limited by a two-thirds vote of the Senate.
- C. The appointees shall be notified in writing of the decision of the Senate.

II (cont.) The President of the Senate shall present the names of the prospective appointees to the Senate Comm. on Comm. for review before the Senate takes action on said appointments.

To amend Bill 2 of the 1st legislative session (Presentation of Appointments) to read as follows:

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

I. Presentation to the Senate

At such time as the President of the Student Association, Vice-President of the Student Association, or and executive officer shall present to the Senate his appointments to the Executive Departments, Supreme Court, lower court, any legally established organ of the Student Association, or any other committee requiring student representation, the names of the appointments and their respective offices shall first be presented to the committee on committees.

II. Voting on Appointments

Such appointments shall be presented to the Senate for its vote at the first regular or special meeting of the Senate following said presentation, and the vote of the Senate as to whether the appointments will be approved shall be as follows:

- A. There shall be a roll call vote on each appointment of the Student Association.
- B. Debate on appointments shall be limited by a two-thirds vote of the Senate.
- C. The appointees shall be notified in writing of the decision of the Senate.

AN ACT

TO ESTABLISH AN IMPROVED POLICY ON STUDENT PARKING DURING SNOW EMERGENCIES

In accordance with the Report of the Committee on Student Parking during Snow Emergencies, be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York at Oswego that:

- 1) Students residing in campus Housing shall be permitted an all night parking privilege in campus lots numbered 1, 5, 14, 17, and 18 during snow emergencies in order that the lots in which they ordinarily park may be cleared of snow.
- 2) This privilege will be extended only at those times when an announcement is made that student cars are to be moved from their assigned lots in order that this phase of snow removal can be accomplished.
- 3) Cars parked in these lots overnight must be removed by 8 AM unless classes have been cancelled, in order that commuting students, faculty, and staff may park in their assigned lots.
- 4) ~~This policy will go into effect with the final approval of the Director of the Campus Security Department.~~

To establish a uniform curfew policy for the women of the State University College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego.

Be it enacted of the Student Senate of the Student Association of the State University College at Oswego:

I. That a no curfew privilege be extended to the women of the State University College at Oswego.

II. Definitions

- A. NO CURFEW PRIVILEGE - shall allow women to return to their dormitories at any hour, before or after the closing hours of that dormitory.
 - 2. no sign out cards are necessary.
 - 3. there will be no deadline for returning.
- B. CURFEW CARD - all cards shall contain the following:
 - 1. name
 - 2. dormitory
 - 3. academic year (68-69)
 - 4. signature of woman student
 - 5. signature of dormitory director
- C. PERMISSION SLIPS - all permission slips to be of a uniform structure and shall contain the signatures of student and parents.

III. Procedure

- A. Any student who has not attained the age of 21 must secure a parental permission slip.
- B. Permission slips and curfew cards will be distributed to dormitory directors by the Student Association and will be available to all women residents.
- C. Upon presentation of signed parental permission to dormitory directors any student under 21 will receive a curfew card.
- D. Upon request of any student over 21 the dormitory director will issue a curfew card to said student.
- E. For admission to the dormitory, after closing hours, the women must show both her curfew card and her identification card, both for the current academic year.
- F. Security officers will be at dormitories at one hour intervals for 15 minutes each hour.

IV. The policy of no curfew will be placed in the college catalogue for the academic year 1969-1970 and in every catalogue henceforth. The class of 1973 and each class henceforth will not be required to attain parental permission. Upon the graduation of the class of 1972, parental permission will no longer be necessary for any women student.

Introduced by Charles Kaplan and Ken Evans

Be it resolved of the Student Association Senate of the State University College at Oswego:

Whereas: Any inequality in the grading and evaluating procedures employed by the professor correspondingly caused by either indiscriminate error, oversight, and or subjective non-comprehensive evaluation has no channels of appeal or recourse that is capable of ascertaining the validity of such inequalities.

Whereas: A student's grade was not as accurate measurement of his level of achievement or indicative of his mastery of subject matter in accordance with fair and equitable grading criteria.

Whereas: In order to prevent these injustices and inequalities the Student Association and the Faculty Assembly both dedicated to the fair and equitable principles of higher education design the machinery necessary to eliminate any of the above inequalities.

Be it resolved that the Student Association strongly supports an Appeal Board that has the power to RE-EVALUATE and RE-EXAMINE any case that falls into the category described above. This board will have the delegated authority to test the individual employing either oral or written exams to measure the student's proficiency in the area in question. Thus it will have the authority to re-grade and re-evaluate the student.
