Bill 29

An Act to amend the Student Association By-Laws

I. Councils of the Senate

Section 1. Responsibilities

The Councils of the Senate are advisory groups which report to the Senate. Each Council is empowered to appoint ad Hoc committees whose duties and responsibilities shall be described by the individual Councils.

Section 2. Standing Councils

The Councils shall be:

1. The Academic Policies Council
2. The Student Affairs Council
3. The Library Council
4. The Admissions Council
5. The Summer Session Council

Section 3. Ad Hoc Committees

Subject to the approval of the Senate, the Chairman of the Senate may from time to time appoint ad hoc committees to report to the Senate on special matters.

Section 4. Membership

All Councils shall have two to four members, except as may be otherwise provided in these By-Laws.

Section 5. Composition of Membership

The membership of the Councils except as otherwise provided shall be composed as follows:

- a) Ex-Officio Member
One or more ex-officio member as described hereinafter
- b) Senate Members
Each senator is required to serve on at least one Council.

Section 6. Selection of Members

At its first meeting the Senate shall elect by secret ballot the members of the Councils. No Senate member shall serve on more than two Councils concurrently.

Section 7. Councils Officers and Reports

At its first meeting, each Council shall elect a Chairman and a Recorder. The Chairman shall report to the Senate on the activities of the Councils.

Section 8. Proposals

Council proposals shall be submitted to the Senate members at least one week in advance of the session at which these proposals are to be acted upon.

Section 9. Meetings

Within three weeks after the first meeting of the new Senate, the Councils shall organize. They shall meet at least once a month during the academic year from May 1st to April 30th. Any two members of a Council may call a meeting of a Council by announcement to the Chairman of the Council.

Section 10. Reports to the President

If a Council of the Senate shall be called upon by the President of Student Association to perform special tasks, the Council shall report its findings and conclusions to the President and the Senate concurrently. No such Council shall have the power to act for the Senate in approving or disapproving policies. Neither shall it make public elsewhere its findings or conclusions prior to reporting to the Senate.

ARTICLE II

FACULTY PARTICIPATION

Section 1. Faculty Representation on Councils

There shall be reciprocity of representation on regular Committees and/or Councils of the Faculty Assembly and Student Association. One member of a Senate Committee or Council shall be elected by that committee or Council to sit as a full member of the corresponding Committee or Council of the Faculty Assembly, and that one member of the corresponding Committee or Council of the faculty organization shall be elected by that Committee or Council to sit on the corresponding Committee or Council of this body with full rights.

Section 2. Designation of Councils and/or Committees

The Department of Faculty Committees shall, after consultation with Faculty Assembly representatives designate for approval by the Senate, the Committees and/or Councils selected for mutual membership.

ARTICLE III

ADMISSIONS COUNCIL

Section 1. Ex-Officio Member

The Director of Admissions

Section 2. Functions

The Admissions Council shall recommend policy as it relates to the admission of undergraduate students to the college.

Section 3. Reports

In addition to its regular reports, the Council shall report in writing to the Senate on admissions criteria currently in effect during the first semester of each academic year.

ARTICLE IV

SUMMER SESSIONS COUNCIL

Section 1. Ex-Officio Member

The Director of Summer Sessions.

Section 2. Functions

The Summer Session Council shall recommend policy as it relates to the conduct of the summer session program.

Section 3. Reports

The Summer Session Council shall make a report to the Senate on the immediately up-coming summer session each spring, and it shall assess the completed summer session in a report to the Senate each fall semester.

ARTICLE V

ACADEMIC POLICIES COUNCIL

Section 1. Ex-Officio Member

The Academic Vice-President

Section 2. Functions

The Academic Policies Council shall be responsible for the long-range planning, organization and evaluation of all aspects of the College's undergraduate program; and shall recommend changes in such programs.

ARTICLE VI

STUDENT AFFAIRS COUNCIL

Section 1. Ex-Officio Member

The Vice-President for Student Affairs.

Section 2. Functions

It shall recommend policy to the Senate on all matters pertaining to the welfare of students not directly concerned with classroom instruction, faculty research, or the public service function of the college.

ARTICLE VII

LIBRARY COUNCIL

Section 1. Ex-Officio Member

The Librarian

Section 2. Functions

The Library Council shall recommend library policy to the Senate on all matters affecting the academic program. It shall be particularly responsible for the continuing development of a sound acquisitions program, review library procedures, and recommend policies on library services to faculty and students.

- III. A floor member may prosecute any resident on his floor who he feels has violated any limitation of his floor has enacted.
- IV. Females are not permitted in male dormitory rooms between 5 a.m. and 6 a.m.

RE: COGS Report of the Proposed Replacement for the Disciplinary Process

The Student Affairs Council recommends the acceptance of the COGS Report in Bill form with certain modifications.

It was felt by some members that perhaps the Student Association Supreme Court should be the judicial body to decide on cases of possible suspension or dismissal, but it has shown an unwillingness to take such cases and feels that students alone are not qualified to make such a decision in which the future of the student is at stake.

The amendments that the Council has suggested are intended either to clarify certain points, erase ambiguities or to better insure due process for the student against whom action has been taken.

Recommended Amendments:

1. Introductory paragraph - second sentence
Only in such cases, involving possible suspension or dismissal, the procedures
2. Article I
address to address
3. Article II, section D
refusing to appear without due cause.
4. Article II, final sentence
Vice President within 96 hours, not to include Saturdays or days in which classes are not in session.
5. Article III
local address and mailed or delivered 96 hours prior to such a hearing not to include Saturdays or day in which classes are not in session.
6. Article IV, section D delete
7. Article IV, add new section D:
Members of the committee may be removed by the appropriate body (i.e. Faculty Assembly, President of the State University College at Oswego or the Student Association). Removal of student members will follow the procedure stated in section II paragraph seven of the Student Association Constitution.
8. Article V, section E
three members of the committee without giving cause and three members on prejudicial grounds
9. Article V, section H
and the student shall be present and have the right to be represented
10. Article VII, insertion of shall:
or the Vice President shall be directed.....
11. Article VII
review by the President of the College when appealed to him by the student. Any modification of the decision of an aforementioned body shall be stated in a specific written explanation and returned to the body and to the student.
12. Article VIII
serve on the Student Conduct Committee, and may be removed from their positions through the same procedure as that stated for the Student Conduct Committee in Article IV.

An Act

Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

- I. A student receiving his first traffic violation on campus will be given a warning ticket. This ticket will incur no penalty of fine.
- II. The violator will be notified of the warning ticket procedure upon presentation of that ticket to the Traffic and Safety Department Office. This must be done to ensure that the violator understands the warning ticket procedure and that this ticket is properly recorded by the Traffic and Safety Department Office.
- III. All Future tickets received by that student will follow the established procedure of on-campus traffic violations during that academic year.
- IV. Only one warning ticket will be given per academic year to all students who have their vehicles properly registered at the Traffic and Safety Office.
- V. This warning ticket will not be subject to appeal.
- VI. This bill will become effective at the beginning of the Fall semester of 1969.

An act**

**Be it enacted of the Senate of the Student Association of
the State University College at Oswego:**

- I. The penalty of fine for parking violations on campus shall be two dollars.**
- II. The penalty of fine for moving violations on campus shall follow the present pattern (i.e. \$2 for the first moving violation, \$4 for the second, \$6 for the third and subsequent moving violations), and shall be recorded separately from parking violations.**
- III. This bill shall become effective at the beginning of the Fall semester of 1969.**
