Resolution # 3

Introduced by Sandy Michaels
and Douglas Hodges

Be it resolved of the Senate of the Student Association of
the State University of New York College at Oswego:

That we, representatives of the student body, support the
following demands of the "Black and Puerto Rican Student Union"

1. More intensive recruitment in predominately
black schools
2. Recruitment of black faculty and staff including
admissions officers.
3. Relevant sources in the library by black authors and
relevant to black studies.
4. Education courses relevant to the needs of black
people and for student teaching centers in urban
areas or ghetto schools.

The Student Association endorses the four demands presented
to the college by the Black and Puerto Rican Student Union on
May 5, 1969. The Student Association recognizes that a total
commitment on the part of administrators and students is
necessary for the realization of these demands. A sustained
effort addressed toward ending social and racial injustice must
be made. The senators fear that increased frustration,
hostility, and violence will develop unless the causes of these
tensions are adequately dealt with.

Resolution #4

Introduced by Paul Lukasiewicz

Be it resolved of the Student Association of the State University of New York College at Oswego:

That, starting with the fall 1969 semester, all restrictive curfews be abolished.

That parental permission not be required for women students for the freedom to come and go as they please from their residence area.

That we believe that this is a positive and necessary measure to insure the basic rights that belong to all members of a functioning, adult society as we have at this college.

That this resolution be sent to the College Council, and that College Council be notified of the ensuing argument as to whether or not parental permission is required, and that the President and Vice President of Student Association present the reasons that parental permission should not be required.

RESOLUTION #5

Introduced by Harold Adler

Be it resolved by the Student Association that on October 15, students are urged not to attend classes or any normal University functions in accordance with the aims of the Vietnam Moratorium bringing to the front the issue of the Vietnam War and showing mass dissatisfaction by the public with the continuance of the war. The S.A. also urges the school administration to officially close this college for that day. We also feel that faculty members should cancel all their classes if school is not officially closed.
