Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

A committee of the above organization be formed. The committee is to be called the SUCO Villiage Committee.

The membership of the committee shall be as follows.

1. The Chairman shall be the Chairman of Inter Dormitory Council or his designee.
2. The Chairman of the Ambulance Committee.
3. Two SA Senators (one commuter, one from on campus).
4. The Chairman of Inter Greek Council or his designee.
5. The president of SA or his designee.
6. One representative from the Hart-Funnelle Complex (Must be president of the dorm).
7. One representative from the Seales-Waterbury-Riggs-Johnson Complex (Must be dorm president).
8. Two representatives from the Seneca-Onondaga-Cayuga-Oneida Complex (Must be a dorm president).
9. One member of the Supreme Court.

The committee shall:

1. Investigate the possibility of incorporating all dormitory buildings and college land outside the City of Oswego as a villiage under the laws of New York State.
2. Suggest the method of enactment of the incorporation in 1 above.

To read as follows: ". . . and each shall at the time of his election be a member of that living center and shall remain a member of that living center for the duration of his office.

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

If any senator fails to attend three consecutive meetings without sending a substitute:

- 1) That the Chair be empowered to request that the delinquent senator appear before the Senate to explain absences.
- 2) Should he decline then the Chair may request that he submit his resignation.
- 3) Upon failure to either appear before the Senate or submit his resignation within a week, the Senate shall proceed with impeachment proceedings.
- 4) The Procedure Committee would be responsible of notification by the Chair for implementation of this bill.

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

Whereas, the Student Association realizes that there are students who are full-time undergraduates, registered at this institution, that are doing independent studies off this campus and

Whereas, student teachers get a refund of their SA fee for the time that they are doing work off this campus,

Be it enacted that anyone who is a full-time undergraduate (taking at least 12 semester hrs.) registered at SUCO, but doing independent studies that require them to be off this campus, be refunded that portion of their SA fee which corresponds to the time they are off campus. Off this campus shall be defined as the inability for the student to participate in any student fee funded activity while they are engaged in the fulfillment of the requirements of that independent study.

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University at New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

A committee of the above organization be formed. The committee is to be called the SUCO Villiage Committee.

The membership of the committee shall be as follows:

1. The Chairman shall be the Chairman of Inter Dormitory Council or his designee.
2. The Chairman of the Ambulance Committee.
3. Two SA Senators (one commuter, one from on campus).
4. The Chairman of Inter Greek Council or his designee.
5. The resident of SA or his designee.
6. One representative from the Hart-Funnelle Complex (Must be a dorm resident)
7. One representative of the Scales-Waterbury-Riggs-Johnson Complex (Must be a dorm president).
8. Two representatives from the Seneca-Onondaga-Cayuga-Oneida Complex. (Must be a dorm president).
9. One member of the Supreme Court.

The committee shall:

1. Investigate the possibility of incorporating all dormitory building and college land outside of Oswego as a villiage under the laws of New York State.
2. Suggest the ways of remaining a separate community the city of Oswego, without becoming a separate villiage.
3. Suggest the method of enactment of the incorporation of 1 above.
4. Investigation of what becoming part of the city of Oswego would mean to the college and the residents on the college grounds, that would become incorporate as non-resident members of the city of Oswego.

Bill 99

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

A committee of the above organization be established, the name of the committee to be the Student Services Investigation Committee. Membership in the committee shall be not less than 5 nor more than 9. It must include at least three senators.

The committee shall be charged with the following:

1. Complete investigation of the College Store.
2. Complete investigation of Food Service.
3. General investigation of Faculty Student Association, including the financial record of same.
4. Complete a list of comprehensive and specific recommendations (in the form of bills) to the Student Association Senate.

This committee shall be empowered to:

1. Draw no more than \$100.00 from the Senate Fund to cover the cost of the investigations (the chairman of the committee must inform the Senate of all proposed expenditures prior to the actual allotment of funds.)
2. Subpoena, in the name of the Student Association Senate, all persons, administrators, faculty, and students to testify and supply any documents related to the College Store, Food Service, and Faculty Student Association central.
3. Officially, request the students on the Board of Directors of Faculty Student Association to take such steps as the committee deem necessary to implement the committee suggestions.
