Bill #1

Introduced by Chair

An Act to amend Bill #74 of the 6th legislative session to provide for the re-balloting in the All-Campus Election.

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

The following policy, procedure, and schedule be implemented for the operation and execution of the Student Association All-Campus Election.

- I. The following sections of Bill #74 shall be deleted:
Ia, Ib, Ic, Id, Ig, IIc, IID, IIIa, IVc, IVd, V, VIa, VIIb, VIId - 1.
- II. The All Campus Election shall be held May 10 and May 11 1971. Section Ie of Bill #74 shall be amended to read:
 1. Residence hall desks - 9:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. on Monday, May 10th and from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday, May 11th.
 2. Hewitt Union Lobby (same as above)
 3. Ontario hall lobby, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
 - f. Tuesday, May 11, 1971, 5:00 PM until finished counting of ballots in Hewitt Union. Only complete results will be announced for each position as the counting is finished. Results will be announced immediately upon availability over WOCR and by way of poster in Union lobby, also in the next edition of the Oswegonian.
- III. Section Ig shall be amended to read: Thursday, May 13, 1971, 9:00 PM, Senate Meeting to request approval of elections and swearing in of new officers and Senate.

IV. Discrepancies in voting in a particular dormitory will invalidate the votes from that dormitory, but not the entire election.

V. All names that appeared on the ballot of April 14th and 15th for President, Vice President, Faculty Student Association, and Faculty Assembly shall reappear unless specifically ordered otherwise by the Student Association Supreme Court.

VI. The Senate shall designate an election chairman and an election supervisor for each dormitory complex and for Ontario and Hewitt Union. That person shall be responsible for recruiting poll watchers from the student body. The following stipends shall be paid to these individuals:

Election Chairman \$40.00

Election Supervisor 35.00

Poll Watchers 1.00 per hour

a. No stipends will be paid in those living centers where the voting discrepancies take place, if such discrepancies are proven before the Supreme Court.

b. Failure of Election supervisors to prevent discrepancies may also be cause for reduction of stipend.

VII. The Election Committee shall consist of the election chairman and the seven election supervisors.

VIII. The committee is responsible for the proper conduct of the elections, the counting of the ballots, and the publication to the student body that re-balloting for campus wide election positions shall take place. Such publication shall be done in the form of handbills, 8 1/2" x 11" posters located conspicuously in all buildings and by announcements on WOCR and WRVO. Handbills and posters must be distributed by noon on Wednesday April 28th.

IX. There will be a new election for senators in Oneida ^{and Seneca, and} hall at the same time as the reballoting for the all campus ^{and Great Hall} positions, due to a discrepancy in the form of the ballot. The same rules will apply as for the all-campus re-balloting and shall be the responsibility of the election supervisor from that dormitory complex.

X. For the purpose of this bill, the dormitory complex shall be defined as:

a. Lonis-Moreland
b. Johnson & Riggs
c. Scales & Waterbury

e. Seneca & Cayuga
d. Hart & Funnelle
f. Onondaga & Oneida

- XI. Ballot boxes will be sealed during the balloting, and will be returned to the Student Association office by the election supervisors at the end of balloting each day. The ballot boxes will remain sealed and will be picked up by the election supervisors prior to the opening of the polls on Tuesday, May 11th, 1971.
- XII. Those elected as a result of this rebaloting shall assume office and be sworn in upon the approval of the election by the Student Senate.

Bill 5

Introduced by Rick Hadley

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

The following guidelines shall be used to disperse and control the Program Fund:

1. This fund shall be an account of the Senate to be used for special programming during the academic year.
2. Each request shall be in writing, and shall include the following:
 - a) Type of event, b) Name of group, exhibit, etc.
 - c) Cost of event including fee, set-up, publicity
 - d) Proposed place of showing, e) Proposed date and time, f) Group responsible.
3. The group or committee may request from the treasurer an accuracy check on the proposed cost.
4. All requests shall be directed to the Senate Finance Committee via the Treasurer's Office.
5. All requests shall be presented to the Senate by the Committee for its decision (except in those cases where the allotment would be \$300 or less, in such case the Senate Finance Committee shall have the power to approve or deny this request.)
6. \$20,000.00 shall be the maximum expenditure or Program Fund during the Fall semester.

7. The Committee shall recommend to the Senate passage or defeat of an entire or change in specific areas.
8. If passed, the Student Association treasurer shall be instructed to establish an account for that project.
9. Money remaining or profits made from this program shall be returned to the Program Fund.
10. This Fund may be used to sponsor any program or any activity that the Senate feels would be of interest to the student body.
11. Requests should be submitted at least three weeks prior to the date on which knowledge of acceptance or denial is needed.
12. Depending upon the program or activity there should be a reasonable period of time for expenditures. When possible a definite period should be affixed to the bill.
13. Any invoices or charges received without prior approval or in excess of the budget allotment, or after the period of time affixed by the Senate will be the liability of the organization.
14. Where the Senate Finance Committee deems it worthwhile then an evaluation of the program or activity shall be conducted by the Committee or requested from the organization.
15. Misrepresentation and/or misuse of funds will be cause for immediate withdrawal of funds by the Senate Finance Committee.

Rationale for \$200 compensation for Kay Guinane for being on Supreme Court 1970-71.

1. As a result of Court functions, I have missed work at the YMCA, total cost - \$50.00
2. As a result of the number of hours necessary to do Court work, I had to give up another part-time job (Avon) in December which cut off income of \$200 (\$10 per week for 5 months.)
3. Although I have dining hall meals, I have had to buy meals as a result of Court functions. Total cost - \$10.

TOTAL COST FOR BEING ON COURT -\$260.00

Since other officers of the Student Association receive compensation for the time they put in, as well as the expenses incurred, it seems only fair that the Court get equal consideration. Certainly, the Senate could not expect some officers to receive money for their services, while others lose money as a result.

Next year the Supreme Court Justices will receive \$200 for their services. It seems only fair that since being on the Court has cost me \$260 this year, that I receive \$200 compensation.

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

The following policy, procedure and schedule be implemented for the operation and execution of the Student Association all-campus referendum.

I. Schedule

- a. May 17 and 18th, the referendum will be held in the following places:
 1. All Dining Halls - from 11:00 to 1:00 PM., and from 5:00 to 7:00 P.M.

 2. Hewitt Union Lobby (counter area) 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
- b. May 18, 1971, 7:00 P.M. until finished counting of ballots in Hewitt Union. Results will be announced immediately upon availability over WOCR and by way of poster in Union lobby, also in the next edition of the Oswegonian.

II. Communications

- a. Senators will announce policy, procedure and schedule in their respective living areas.
- b. WOCR - public service announcements.
- c. Newspaper
 1. One full-page of advertisement in the Oswegonian.

II. Communications (Cont'd)

- d. Two sets of posters, to be placed in all dining halls and Hewitt Union.
- e. Flyers in all living areas and academic buildings.

III. Method of Control

- a. On campus residents will vote in the dining hall in which they are assigned. Student Association I.D.'s will be X'ed on Front Side and a student's name will be checked off a master occupancy list as certified by individual dorm directors.
- b. Off campus residents will vote in Hewitt Union lobby. Student Association I.D.'s will be checked and a list of those who reside off campus will be checked.
- c. Discrepancies in voting in a particular area will invalidate the votes from that area, but not the entire referendum.

- IV. The Senate shall designate a Referendum Chairman and a Supervisor for each area and for Hewitt Union. That person shall be responsible for recruiting poll watchers from the student body. The following stipends shall be paid to these individuals:

Referendum Chairman - \$50.00
Referendum Supervisors - \$25.00
Poll Watchers - \$1.25 per hour

Poll Watchers

- a. No stipends will be paid in those areas where the voting discrepancies take place, if such discrepancies are proven before the Supreme Court.
 - b. Failure of Referendum Supervisors to prevent discrepancies may also be cause for reduction of stipend.
- V. The Referendum Committee shall consist of the referendum chairman and the six referendum supervisors.

The Committee is responsible for the proper conduct of the counting of the ballots, and the publication to the student body.

VI. Responsibility

- a. The members of the Referendum Committee shall be legally responsible for the proper execution of the foregoing schedule, policy and procedures. The Referendum Committee must rule appropriateness of campaign activities in the polling building commensory with the policies described by the appropriate directors of the polling building.
- b. The persons staffing the polling place shall be legally responsible for the proper operation and execution of the balloting themselves during the following period of time:

Hewitt Union - May 17 and 18, 9:00 AM to 5:00 P.M.
Dining Halls - May 17 and 18, 11:00 to 1:00 P.M. and
5:00 to 7:00 P.M.

- c. The Senators and the officers of Student Association shall be responsible for the constitutionality and appropriateness of the policies, procedures and schedule.

VII. The number of full-time undergraduate student enrollment, projected for 1971-72 is 6,648. These figures are from the office of Dr. Burt Sterling.

Introduced by Vicki McLean

Be it enacted by the Student Association Senate of the State University of New York, College of Arts and Sciences at Oswego that:

Article I, Section III, No. 3 of the Student Association Constitution which now reads:

"All Senators shall be elected at the time of the All-Campus Election" be changed to read:

"One senator per 200 people in a living area shall be elected at the time of the All-Campus election. They shall serve for one year from that time or when elections are validated.

One senator per 200 people in a living area shall be elected in November. They shall serve for one year from that time, or when elections are validated.
