We're seeing lots of evidence of [SUNYergy](#). And it certainly is not restricted to the library. One such example was the process that led to the addition of the Gale Literature Resource Center Archive to SUNYConnect-wide electronic resources earlier this year.

This is a multi-year agreement that resulted in significant cost savings for SUNY. SUNY's Literature Resource Center Archive includes material from Associations Unlimited, Biography and Genealogy Master Index, Contemporary Authors, The Times Digital Archive and many other sources.

The OLIS, the SUNY Finance Department, Nylink and Gale worked together to make these resources available for all SUNYConnect institutions. "The Digital Archive Program will provide great benefit to SUNY and your support and partnership are sincerely appreciated" (SUNY's Sharon Gallagher).

At 10:20 the web links to FIT's online catalog were pointed to the Aleph server - the first bibliographic instruction class using the new system will be given tomorrow. By tomorrow we will have eight kiosks throughout the library dedicated to searching StyleCat. Cataloging and Periodicals will be coming up in the next week or two. Acquisitions will end the transition suite sometime during the summer.
