

Current definition

Academic Good Standing: A student is considered in good standing unless expelled, suspended, or academically dismissed from SUNY Poly and not re-admitted.

Proposed definition

Academic Good Standing: A student is in good standing with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. Students who are expelled, suspended, on academic warning, or academically dismissed from SUNY Poly are not in good standing at the college.

The proposed change would match what currently happens on the student academic transcript. The current definition causes confusion. The next line in the catalog is Academic Warning which is defined as

Academic Warning: At the completion of each semester, each student's academic record is routinely reviewed, and **if the cumulative grade point average is below 2.00, the student is placed on academic warning for the following semester.**

This does not support the current definition of good standing. Students are defined as on warning, but the definition of good standing does not exclude the warning group from good standing.

If this proposal is accepted, the following change is proposed to make clarification:

Current definition

Readmission Following Academic Dismissal: Students dismissed for academic deficiencies who wish to apply for readmission to SUNY Poly must submit their written application to the Registrar's Office to be reviewed by Dismissal Appeals Committee. The committee will evaluate the application and make a determination as to readmission. The committee may delay readmission until one full semester has elapsed and will generally do so if a student is applying for readmission a second time. A student granted readmission to SUNY Poly will be placed on academic reinstatement. Establishing matriculation in a degree program is governed by the regulations for matriculation in that program at the time of readmission.

Proposed definition

Readmission Following Academic Dismissal: Students dismissed for academic deficiencies who wish to apply for readmission to SUNY Poly must submit their written application to the Registrar's Office to be reviewed by Dismissal Appeals Committee. The committee will evaluate the application and make a determination as to readmission. The committee may delay readmission until one full semester has elapsed and will generally do so if a student is applying for readmission a second time. A student granted readmission to SUNY Poly will be placed on academic reinstatement. Establishing matriculation in a degree program is governed by the regulations for matriculation in that program at the time of readmission. **The status of academic reinstatement is equivalent to academic warning.**
