ADMISSIONS CRITERIA FOR FIRST-YEAR COLLEGE STUDENTS WITH A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA FALL 2005

The Faculty Senate of the State University of New York College at Brockport recommends that for the 2004-05 admissions cycle the College recruit a regular admit first-year college student class with a mean SAT score of 1100 or higher (ACT 24) and a mean high school average of 90 or higher so that the College maintains its position as a Tier 2 institution (based on admissions selectivity) with the State University System.

With these parameters for its regular first-year admits, the college should begin to shape its additional admissions categories by permitting the Admissions Office to give special consideration to students who:

- a. Take particularly strong high school academic programs;
- b. Demonstrate in some significant ways a high potential not matched by other traditional measures based on past performance; or
- c. Bring unique experiences in such areas as the arts, performance, community service, international education, or cultural diversity.

To be considered for admission, the Faculty Senate further recommends that:

High school graduates complete the Regents program, or earn a minimum of 18 academic units (including the senior year).

- 4 English
- 4 Social Studies
- 3 College preparatory math
- 3 Science (one with lab)
- 4 Additional academic courses, which could include foreign language (three years of foreign language is highly recommended), math, science, English, social studies, fine art, or technology education.

A regularly admitted first-year college student entering SUNY Brockport during the 2004-05 admissions cycle may receive a scholarship if the SAT score is 1100 or above (or ACT of 24 or above), high school average of 90 or better, and a standing in the top 25% of the graduating class.

To be considered for admission as a regular admit first-year college student, a high school graduate should have a minimum SAT score of 1000 (ACT of 21) and a minimum high school average of 85.

In addition to the regular admit first-year college student, the Faculty Senate recommends that students with a high school diploma, or equivalency diploma, who meet the aforementioned recommended criteria for academic units may be admitted to SUNY Brockport during the 2004-05 admissions cycle in one of the following special categories subject to the condition that the percentage of special admit first-year college students should not exceed the level (15%) stipulated in the Strategic Planning Document.

A. *Transition First-Year College Students*

The SAT score should be above 900 and high school grade point of at least 82.

Exceptional Talent

(Students who have a unique or outstanding qualities in such areas as athletics or the fine arts)

The SAT score should be above 900 (or ACT score above 19) and high school grade point is above 78.

B. *EOP*

(For students who do not meet the regular admissions criteria, but who do meet income guidelines set by New York State)

1. If the student has completed 15 academic units, including a minimum one year of college preparatory math (Course 1)
2. If the high school average is 78 or above.
3. If the SAT score is 800 or above (or ACT of 16 or above).

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

To be considered for admission as a regular transfer student, the Faculty Senate further recommends a minimum transfer GPA of 2.5 or higher in academic courses.

EOP transfer students remain at a 2.25 GPA.

A transfer student entering SUNY Brockport during the 2004-05 admissions cycle may receive a scholarship if the transfer GPA is 3.75 or above (junior status).
