GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS WHO MATRICULATED IN SUNY FALL 2000 AND LATER.

SUNY College at Brockport recognizes several groups of transfer students, based on the college last attended and total number of credits earned.

From two-year colleges.

1. Students awarded an approved associate's degree from a regionally accredited college may transfer up to 64 credits. These degrees are the Associate of Arts (AA), the Associate of Science (AS), and the Associate of Applied Science (AAS). Even though such students will be granted at least 60 credits and junior status, they may need more than 60 additional credits to complete the baccalaureate degree requirements depending on their degrees, specific courses and academic programs. This is particularly true for students who enter with AAS degrees.
2. Students without an approved associate's degree from a regionally accredited college may transfer up to 64 credits and be granted junior status.

From four-year colleges.

Students who have transferred from a regionally accredited four-year college or university will be awarded no more than 90 credits toward their bachelor's degree.

All transfer students must complete at least 15 credits of their academic major at SUNY Brockport and, where applicable, at least half of the credits for a minor and for a certification program. Students should consult the current catalog since some programs have more restrictive requirements.

I. The General Education Requirements for students who transfer 24 or more credits include:

- The ten knowledge and skills areas of the SUNY general education program, specifically Mathematics, Natural Science, Social Science, Humanities, American History, Western Civilization, Other World Civilizations, Fine Arts, Foreign Language and Basic Communication.
- One Contemporary Issues course.
- One Perspectives on Women course.
- One Diversity course.
- The SUNY Brockport competency examinations in Computer Skills, Writing, and Mathematics when they are implemented.

Transfer credits may be used to fulfill all requirements except the competency exams.

II. General Education Requirements for students who transfer fewer than 24 credits.

All SUNY Brockport general education requirements as required of first year students. Transfer credits may be applied to any of these requirements except the competency exams.

**GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS WHO ENTERED SUNY
BEFORE FALL 2000**

I. Students who matriculated in SUNY prior to Fall 2000 and who received an AA or AS degree before their first admission to SUNY Brockport will be regarded as having completed the lower division knowledge and skills requirements.

They must, however, meet the local SUNY Brockport general education requirements:

- A. One Contemporary Issues course.
- B. One Perspectives on Women course.
- C. One Diversity course.
- D. The SUNY Brockport competency examinations in Computer Skills, Writing, and Mathematics as they are implemented.

Transfer credits may be used to fulfill any of these requirements except the competency exams.

II. All other transfer students who matriculated in SUNY prior to Fall 2000 must meet the same General Education as those who first matriculated in SUNY after Fall 2000 and who have completed 24 or more credits. These requirements include:

- A. The ten knowledge and skills areas of the SUNY general education program.
- B. One Contemporary Issues course.
- C. One Perspectives on Women course.
- D. One Diversity course.
- E. The SUNY Brockport competency examinations in Computer Skills, Writing, and Mathematics when they are implemented.

Transfer credits may be used to fulfill any of these requirements except the competency exams.
