Proposed Thesis or Project Continuance Policy

Whereas: Once a student has registered for a thesis/ project, work on the thesis/project is seen as a continuous process until all requirements are completed.

Whereas: The completion of a master's thesis/project involves ongoing consultation with faculty and/or use of institutional resources.

Whereas: Unregistered students using College facilities constitute a liability risk.

Therefore: Graduate students who:

- have registered for the maximum number of program thesis/project credits and
- have not yet completed the thesis/project

must register for one credit of research/project continuance each semester until the thesis/project has been completed and approved. Continuance credits carry no grade and do not count toward degree requirements.
