Public Administration 45 Credit Proposal

(11/27/00)

Our 45 credit for preservice students proposal would allow a full-time student to pursue their MPA degree in 18 months, as opposed to another whole semester gaining 3 credits.

Example of 45 credit program for preservice students.

Semester	Term	TOTAL CREDITS 45 hour program	TOTAL CREDITS 48 hour program
Semester 1	Fall 2000	12 credits	12 credits
Semester 2	Spring 2001	12 credits	12 credits
Semester 3	Summer 2001	9 credits (the 6 credit internship plus one elective)	9 credits
Semester 4	Fall 2002	12 credits – Degree completed for a December 2002 graduation.	12 credits
Semester 5	Spring 2002	<i>None</i>	3 credits – Degree completed for a May 2002 graduation.
	<i>TOTAL CREDITS</i>	<i>45 credits</i>	<i>48 credits</i>

*Note, students must take 4 courses (12 credits) to qualify for financial aid.

PROPOSAL

The Department of Public Administration requests a decrease of three (3) credits in the number of required credits for our Preservice students (those who have not had two years of professional work experience). This decrease will not affect our national accreditation in any way.

The following pages contain the rationale (page 2), and a curriculum comparison (page 3).

RATIONALE

At present our Preservice students (those not possessing a minimum of two years of professional work experience) are required to take 48 credits, which includes a six-credit internship experience. Our Inservice students (those possessing a minimum of two years of professional work experience) are required to take 42 credit hours.

We are requesting a reduction in hours required for Preservice students from 48 to 45. We would meet accreditation standards by still offering a six-credit internship and allowing our students to drop one (1) elective. A review of MPA programs reveals an average credit requirement of 42 or 45 credits nationally.

This reduction would eliminate an extra semester and allow full-time Preservice students to complete the program in a more timely manner.

This reduction will not affect accreditation in any way.
