FRESHMEN ADMISSIONS CRITERIA FOR STUDENTS WITH A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

The faculty Senate of the State University of New York College at Brockport recommends that for the 2000-01 admissions cycle the College recruit a regular admit freshmen class with a mean SAT score of 1050 or higher and a mean high school average of 87.5 or higher so that the College may be placed in the group of Tier 2 institutions (based on admissions selectivity) within the State University System.

To be considered for admission, the Faculty Senate further recommends that:

High School Graduates complete the Regents program, or earn a minimum of 18 [17] academic units (including the senior year).

- 4 English
- 4 Social Studies
- 3 College preparatory math
- 3 Science (one with lab)
- 4 (3) Additional academic courses, which could include foreign language (three years of foreign language is highly recommended), math, science, English, social studies, fine arts, or technology education.

To be considered for admission as a regular admit freshman, a high school graduate should have a minimum SAT score of 1000 (ACT of 21) and a minimum high school average of 82.

A regularly admitted freshman entering SUNY Brockport during the 2000-01 admissions cycle may receive a scholarship if the SAT score is 1150 or above (or ACT of 25 or above), high school average of 91 or better, and a standing in the top 20% of the graduating class.

In addition to the regular admit freshman, the Faculty Senate recommends that students with a high school diploma, or equivalency diploma, who meet the aforementioned recommended criteria for academic units may be admitted to SUNY Brockport during the 2000-01 admissions cycle in one of the following special categories subject to the condition that the percentage of special admit freshmen should not exceed the level (20%) stipulated in the Strategic Planning Document.

I. Transition Freshmen (Summer Program)

If the SAT score is above 950 (or ACT score above 20) and high school grade between 78 and 81.

II. Excel

If the SAT score is above 1100 (or ACT score above 24) and high school

grade point is above 78.

III. Exceptional Talent (Students who have a unique or outstanding qualities in such areas as athletics or the fine arts)

If the SAT score is above 900 (or ACT score above 19) and high school grade point is above 78.

IV. EOP (For students who do not meet the regular admissions criteria, but who do meet income guidelines set by NYS.)

1. If the student has completed 15 [14] academic units, including a minimum one year of college preparatory math (Course I).
2. If the high school average is 78 or above.
3. If the SAT score is 800 or above (or ACT of 16 or above).

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

To be considered for admission as a transfer student, the Faculty Senate further recommends a minimum transfer GPA of 2.25 or higher in academic courses.

A transfer student entering SUNY Brockport during the 2000-01 admissions cycle may receive a scholarship if the transfer GPA is 3.75 or above.
