PROPOSAL FOR HLL (Health Science majors – liberal arts track) CURRICULUM**

The Health Science Undergraduate Curriculum Committee, with unanimous approval of the faculty, would like to propose the following changes in curriculum for all Health Science liberal arts students. We believe that the block format would serve to enhance the quality of the program by providing direction and clarification of objectives.

The changes would **not** require a change in total number of credit hours, nor would it require the formulation of any new courses. We would only like to add a core course requirement and reformat the program with existing course offerings.
