Coach Marty Kentner and the varsity basketball team will take the New York Central this Thursday morning after a sendoff assembly at BSTI. Captained by John Szymanski, the following men will travel to Binghamton to play against a strong Cobleskill five: Byrne, Dimenico, Helfeldt, Hughes, Maciag, Runyan, Steeg and Todaro. Manager Dick Waterstrat and his assistant Zeman will accompany the players, as will Athletic Director Allen Davis who is attending a meeting with Dr. Lawrence L. Jarvie on Friday. "The purpose of the meeting is to correlate athletics in the institutes," said Mr. Davis.

Eleven varsity teams will compete—6 from the formerly established agricultural and technical institutes at Alfred, Vanton, Cobleskill, Delhi, Farmingdale, and Morrisville—and 5 from the institutes of applied arts and sciences established in 1946—Binghamton, Brooklyn, Buffalo, Utica, and White Plains.

The schedule follows: Thursday, March 9, 6:00 p.m., Alfred vs. Canton; 7:30 p.m., Buffalo vs. Cobleskill; 9:00 p.m., Morrisville vs. Farmingdale; Friday, March 10, 2:00 p.m., Binghamton vs. winner of Alfred-Canton; 3:30 p.m., White Plains vs. Utica; 7:30 p.m., Brooklyn vs. winner of Cobleskill-Buffalo; and 9:00 p.m., Delhi vs. winner of Morrisville-Farmingdale.

Angelo Pefanis presided at the special meeting of the Student Athletic Council on March 2 which made the trip possible. "With Student Council and Student Athletic Council sharing the expense, the BSTI Flames can make the trip, and represent Buffalo in the first state tourney to be held. We feel very strongly that the team deserves the trip, and we wish them "the best" on Thursday—and Friday!" said Angie.

Special arrangements may be made to allow Waterstrat to accompany the varsity. He has just been assigned to cooperative training.
