that you may pass on to the boys still plugging at the Institute—that is, to learn every lesson given, also to listen and to pay strict attention to instructions. This is the real thing out here, where thinking pays off.

"The background that I had at the Institute is very helpful. If I had not had it, I'd probably be using the pick and shovel right now. Don't get the impression that I have mastered all the angles of this game. Actually, it will take several years' experience just to get out of kindergarten.

"I do find the work interesting, and there is something new to learn every day. (N. B. I can see a smile on your face; you no doubt went through similar experiences!)

"The type of work I am doing runs something like this. Design crane rail (2 ton), estimate cost, order steel for rail, and rebuilding. Install crane. (Thanks to Mr. Pantan, that job never fell down.) Design scaffold and templates for stoves and furnaces. Compute quantities of brick removed, also steel slag removed from furnace. Write payrolls out. Drafting. Compute quantities of wood needed for a job. And work with men from all walks of life."
