Buffalo State Technical Institute will be host to 30 educators from the 11 state technical and agricultural institutes for a series of four curriculum workshops this Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. F. Edward Almstead, curriculum coordinator for the institutes, will come from Albany to attend. The institutes form 11 of the 33 component units of the State University of New York.

Mrs. Ruth E. Lake, librarian at BSTI, is state chairman of the library workshop which will have as guest speakers, Miss Frances G. Hepinstall, librarian at Buffalo State Teachers College, Mr. Almstead, and Miss Marguerite A. Roty, secretary to the BSTI director, Richard R. Dry. Miss Hepinstall will speak at 10:30 a.m. Thursday on Library Planning (by one who has just lived through it). Mr. Almstead will be consultant Friday morning on Current Projects, Research Methods, Statistics, and Procedures. Miss Roty will serve as consultant on standardization of bulletins as part of the discussion of institute librarian's news publication problems.
