

### Dr. Carlson to speak

Dr. William S. Carlson, president of State University of New York, will deliver the commencement address when the 1952 class of seniors is graduated from Buffalo State Technical Institute. Director Richard R. Dry made the announcement today, saying that the fourth annual commencement will be held in Kleinhans Music Hall on Wednesday, August 6 at 8:30 p. m.

Dr. Carlson has chosen as his subject, "The Desire to Work". He assumed his new duties as president of State University of New York on April 1. He had been president of the University of Vermont, and before that, of the University of Delaware.

Two hundred and fifty seniors will receive their degrees of associate in applied science this year upon completion of the two-year work-study course. This year's class will bring the total alumni of the Buffalo Institute to 1200. Candidates will be graduated from Construction Technology, Dental Hygiene, Electrical Technology, Food Service Administration, Industrial Chemistry, Mechanical Technology, Metallurgical Technology, and Optical Technology.

For the first time this year the Institute will make an "award for outstanding service rendered to the Institute" since its beginning in 1946. The award which is in the form of a plaque has been named the State University Institute of Applied Arts and Sciences Distinguished Service Award. The committee in charge includes Mrs. Grace O. Hunt, Lawrence E. Spring, and Arthur C. Flentge. Dr. Lawrence L. Jarvie, executive dean of technical institutes and community colleges, will make the presentation.

The Buffalo Institute Board of Trustees of which Charles C. Fichtner is acting chairman, will entertain for Dr. Carlson at a dinner at the Buffalo Club, preceding the commencement exercises. Class Day will be in the Institute auditorium on Tuesday, August 5, at 8 p. m.

Because this is the first time that Dr. Carlson has made a commencement address in Buffalo, alumni are invited to hear him.
