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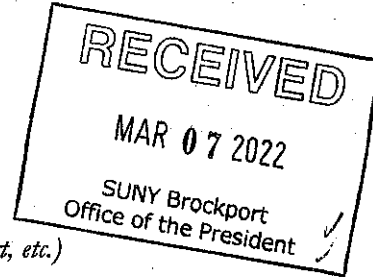

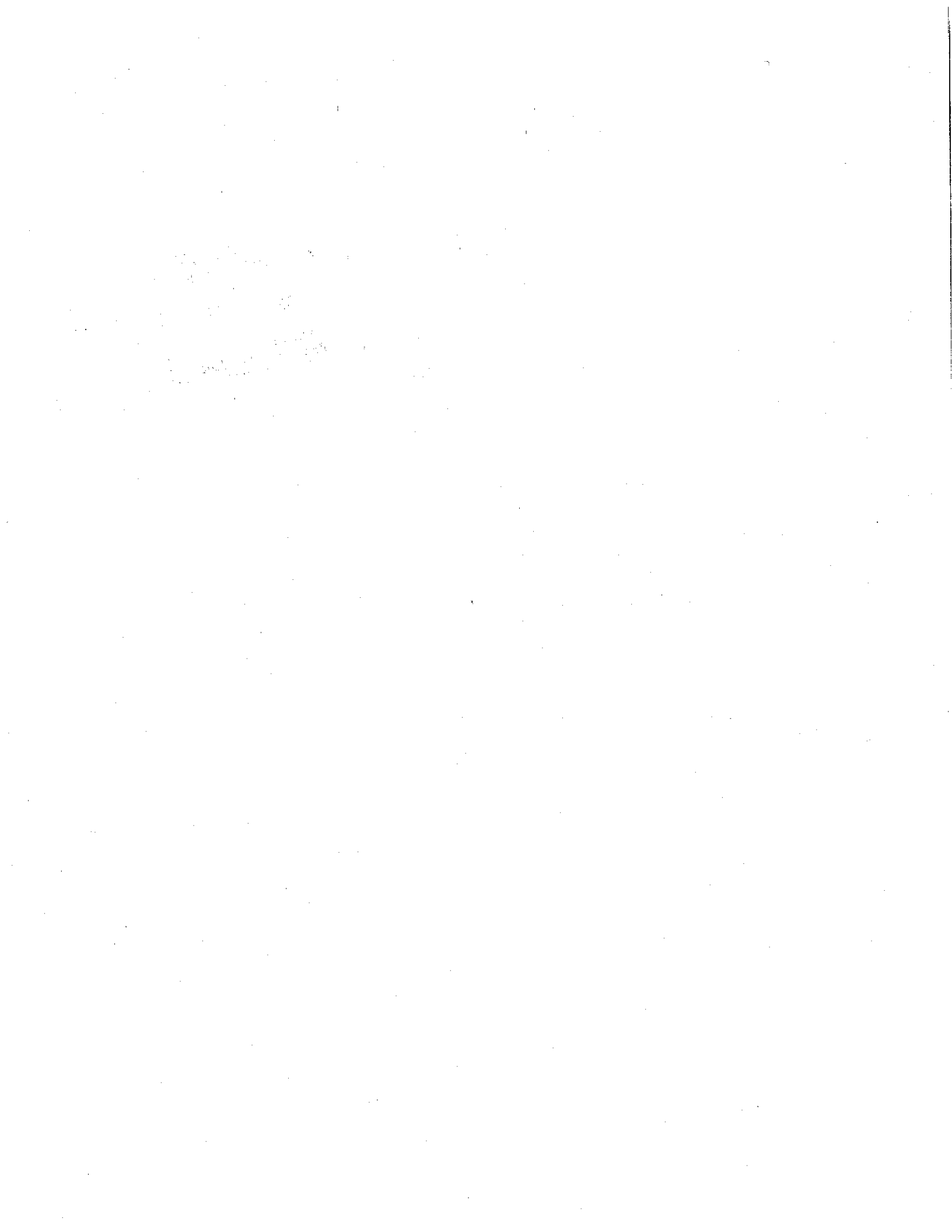

Title of Proposal in Title Style

Readmit Policy for Dismissed Undergraduate Students

Brief Description of Proposal

Examine our current readmit policy which requires academically dismissed students who either don't appeal or their appeal is denied to "sit out" two full semesters before applying to return. We propose a pilot for the 22-23 academic year which would allow dismissed students to appeal to return after one semester. If successful, we could follow procedure to change the policy. The criteria for appeal would be successful completion of ≥ 12 credits at a community or 4 year college with a ≥ 2.5 GPA (with submission of official transcripts) and a statement indicating why they would be successful if they return to Brockport. There are likely retention benefits to having students return after one semester. In addition, we have no data indicating two semesters out is more beneficial than one.

Budgetary Resources Needed

No new resources required.

Student Learning Outcomes Assessment Data

Students are dismissed for a variety of reasons. Especially in this era of COVID, we should remain flexible with our policy given extenuating circumstances. If a student has a valid appeal, there is no data that supports a student would be any more successful by sitting out an additional semester.

Readmit Policy for Dismissed Students – Pilot

Background: Currently, undergraduate students who are academically dismissed from the college must “sit out” two semesters before applying to return. Upon successful reapplication, these students are advised by the Vice-Provosts office and are guided in the appropriate courses and major upon their return. This policy has existed, without review, for years, yet there is no active evidence from the Vice-Provost or Undergraduate Admissions that indicates two semesters are necessary.

Motivation: With the changes we are seeing to student needs since covid and enrollment projections being what they are, we believe students are more likely to come back and be successful if they have an opportunity to come back sooner. Many have moved on with their lives after a full year. This will be reviewed over the year, as this is a pilot.

Staffing/budget: No concerns or budget considerations

Assessment: We will look back at the number of students who have returned after dismissal before and after this pilot. We will track their standing and progress to degree. We will revisit this proposal after two semesters and if the progress warrants, we will resubmit for a full policy change.

Timeline: Begin as soon as possible and review for two academic semesters.

Letters of Support/Dissent: None, but this policy was written in conjunction between the Director of Undergraduate Admissions, the Vice-Provost for Academic Affairs and with support from the Academic Success Center.

RE: Readmission following academic dismissal

Currently, the policy states undergraduate students who have been academically dismissed are not eligible to apply for readmission for a minimum of one year from the date of separation. That policy has been in effect for many years and it's not clear why students must wait a full year. Per conversations and agreement among the deans, we support a pilot program to allow dismissed students to return after one semester provided they have demonstrated they are prepared to meet the academic standards of the College. This will be accomplished by attending a community or other college for a semester and earning a minimum of a 2.5 GPA.

We believe many students will be able to address the issues that lead to their dismissal and will be prepared to return after one semester. I fully support this proposal and very much hope it is approved by Senate.
