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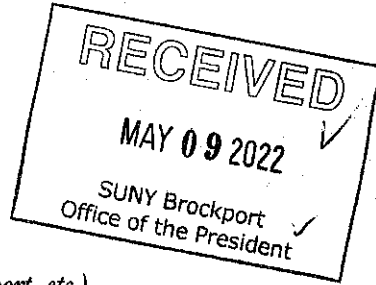



Therapeutic Recreation Curriculum change

Rationale:

This proposal highlights a change in the Therapeutic Recreation curriculum. Effective January 1 2022, the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (credentialing body for Therapeutic Recreation profession) changed its certification requirements from 15 credit hours to a minimum of 18 credit hours in Therapeutic Recreation content coursework. The Therapeutic Recreation program is aligned with the NCTRC requirements enabling students to be eligible for certification upon graduation. This certification change requires the TR core to increase from 5 courses to 6 courses. In order to make this change without altering the total credit hours REL 409 is replacing REL 306 for Therapeutic Recreation students.

I offer my support for the Department of Recreation, Therapeutic Recreation and Tourism's proposal to increase the Therapeutic Recreation program core curriculum from five to six courses. This change is necessary to align with the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation certification requirement being increased from 15 credits to a minimum of 18 credits. Additionally, I support replacing REL 306 (Issues of Diversity and Disability in Recreation) with REL 409 (Therapeutic Recreation for Diverse Populations) for therapeutic recreation students to ensure that the increase in credits in the core does not change total credit hours in the major. I fully endorse the proposed change and do not foresee any additional faculty resources necessary to implement this change.

RE: RTRT proposal to add REL 409 to the Therapeutic Recreation concentration and remove REL 306

Please accept this memo in support of RTRT's proposal to add REL 409 to the Therapeutic Recreation (TR) concentration curriculum and remove REL 306. Effective January 1 2022, the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (credentialing body for Therapeutic Recreation profession) changed its certification requirements from 15 credit hours to a minimum of 18 credit hours Therapeutic Recreation content coursework. This requires the TR core to increase from 5 courses to 6 courses. Therefore, it is proposed that REL 409 Therapeutic Recreation for Diverse Populations be added to the TR curriculum and REL 306 Issues of Diversity and Disability in Recreation be removed to yield a net change of zero credits. REL 409 is specific to TR whereas REL 306 is more related to the recreation field in general.
