Faculty Senate Admissions Committee
Resolution on Use of Scholars' Day as an
Admissions Recruitment Opportunity

The Faculty Senate of the State University College at Brockport recommends that the Brockport Scholars' Day be employed to demonstrate the high quality of educational opportunity available at the college. Specifically, we recommend that selected high school teachers be invited to bring three to five students each to the Scholars' Day program, and that tours and other appropriate amenities be provided for these special guests.

RATIONALE

Scholars' Day is an appropriate recruitment event since it:

is a showcase for the scholarly activity of both faculty and students,
offers college level lectures that are of general interest, and
demonstrates that we are a college where intellectual excitement is
a reality.

Selected high school teachers are an important group to invite because:

many teachers are our valued friends, students, and graduates who
deserve some special recognition from us,

they have professional interest in the areas covered by Scholars'
Day and can use the event to enhance their own excitement with
learning, and

high school teachers are influential in the college selection process
and can help create a positive image of Brockport with their students.

Small, selected groups of high school students should be invited to
accompany their teachers because:

we want guests who will appreciate and benefit from college level
presentations,

space for guests will be limited, and

we are not necessarily attempting to recruit specific guests as
students, but rather are hoping to build an appreciation for Brockport
among some of the ablest high school students in the area.
