Parking Services is currently in the process of mailing over 7,000 new permit validators. Renewal of the permit is free. Permits will be mailed directly to home addresses provided that:

1. There are no outstanding summonses.
2. The permit holder is a current employee as indicated by the Human Resource database.
3. The home address provided by Human Resources is the current address.

If all three criteria are met, Faculty/Staff members will receive a holographic security sticker to be placed on top of the current permit expiration date. It is very important that the current permit be kept!
