Senate Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 5:12 p.m.

Senators not present were: Sen. Smith, Sen. Rainford (sub-Miss Miller), Sen. Hann (sub-Mr. Burns), Sen. Balaban, Mr. Martin, Sen. Hanks, Miss Heilig, Sen. Kortmulder (sub-Gloria Greenfield), Sen. Sachi, Mr. Schifferli, Eric (sub-Winnie Mulinack), Gary (sub-Karin Sexton), Mr. O'Keefe (sub-Mr. Ozolins), and Sen. Bucher, and Sen. McCarthy

Sen. Thompson moved to approve the agenda (2nd-Sen. Kszystyniak) . Jeff requested that he be allowed to speak under executive reports, and Sen. Cherson also, to report on PPB. So, amended, the agenda was approved.

Sen. Kszystyniak moved to approve the minutes, it carried. (2nd-Sen. Harmony)

Executive Reports

Vice-President Gates read the resignation of Sen. Kszystyniak as co-chair person of the Judiciary and Constitutional Revision Committee, and noted that the senator recommended Sen. Riebling to replace him. The Chair then reminded the senate of the decision to appoint any senators not presently serving on committees, on one of his choice, if not requested otherwise. The appointments were as follows: Ways and Means Sen. Greenstein, Eric Sen. Quackenbush, Miss Roman. Student Affairs Sen. Faulter, Sen. Grasso, and Mr. Ozolins. Academic Affairs Sen. Kortmulder, Mr. Rainford, and Mr. Schifferli. Judiciary and Constitutional Revision Sen. Balaban, Gary Stevenson, Miss McDonough. Jeff then spoke with the purpose of informing the body as to the Student Senate's actions regarding freezing of athletic funds at the State University College at Buffalo. Sen. Cherson then reported the names of the staff of PPB for next year. Pertaining to the Investigation Committee, he reported that Sen. Kronenbitter had resigned from the committee, and on the administrations justification of the recent hitch-hiking arrests in question. The committee will meet Mr. Durham on Thursday. Sen. Harmony (2nd-Sen. Kszystyniak) moved to open the floor to recommendations for nominations to SASU. The recommendations and final votes were: Deb Ellwanger-16, Sen. Melech-9, Brian Angell-9, Chuck DiNatale-0, and Gloria Greenfield-10. Sen. Thompson then requested that Joe Russo be allowed to conduct an informal discussion as to the creation, and SA funding of a new student newspaper. It was decided that an ad-hoc committee shall be set up to investigate the matter further, with Sen. Thompson as chair-person.

Committee Reports

Judiciary and Constitutional Revision - Sen. Riebling reported that they still need supervisors for Cayuga, Seneca, and Riggs, and that the dates on the petitions were a mistake and have now been officially changed to March 30th, at 3 p.m.. The committee is also working on publicity and amendments for the referendum.

Internal Affairs Miss Ellwanger reported that Resolution 27 has been referred to College Affairs, and that Bill 139 to Judiciary and Constitutional Revision.

College Affairs- Sen. Kronenbitter reported that they discussed Senior Week activities, with 4 present at the meeting, and that at this time the

committee will not meet until more new business comes up.

Old Business

Bill 95 Sen. Kszystyniak sponsored the bill (2nd- Sen. Thompson), after discussion the veto was sustained with a vote of 13-yes, 12-no, and 1-abs.

Bill 136 Sen. Harmony sponsored the Bill (2nd-Sen. Hann), and it carried after discussion with 24-yes, 0-no, and 1-abs.

Jeff then called for special Orders of the day for Resolution 29 (2nd-Sen. Balaban) and the motion carried, so did the resolution, 19-yes, 7-abs. Sen. Harmony then requested that copies of Bills 108 and 139, and resolutions 20 and 29 be included in the packet the next meeting. It was so noted.

Ways and Means Committee Report

Sen. Hann explained the minutes, but Sen. Redlo moved to amend them to fund the Tai Chi Chu'an Workshop in full. (2nd-Sen. Thompson) By a unanimous vote of 24, the minutes stood approved.

Appropriation Bills

Bill 140- Sen. Thomspn sponsored the bill (2nd-Sen. Melech). Sen. Melech proposed to amend the total amount to \$775.00, (2nd-Sen. Harmony), and it and the bill as amended carried, both with 25 unanimous yes votes.

Bill 141 - The bill was sponsored by Sen. Harmony, (2nd-Ms. Charette), and Jeff proposed to amend the allocation for Communication and Publicity to \$35.00. (2nd- Gloria). The amendment carried by a unanimous hand vote. The bill as amended passed with 23-yes, 0-no, and 1-abs.

Resolutions -

Res. 28 Sen. Kszystyniak and Sen. Harmony withdrew their sponsorship and there were no motions to sponsor it to the floor.

Sen. Harmony moved to adjourn (2nd- Mr. Schifferli), it carried, and the senate stood adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

April 3, 1973

Senate Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 5:17

Senators not present were: Sen. Smith, Sen. Grasso, Sen. Greenstein, Sen. Hanks, Sen. Kronenbitter, Sen. Sachi, Sen. Stevenson, (sub-Ms. Sexton), Mr. O'Keefe (sub-Mr. Ozolins), Miss Roman, Ms. Dieli (sub-Ms. Charette) and Sen. Hewitt (sub-Ms. Heilig)

Senator Hann Proposed to amend the agenda putting Bill 118 first in New Business. (2nd-Mr. Brandte) Sen. Cherson moved to amend by putting Resolution 31 after Bill 142. Both motions carried and the amended agenda was approved.

Sen. Harmony moved to approve the minutes (2nd-Sen. Kszystyniak), and they were changed: including Ms. Dieli (sub-Ms. Charette), and Sen. Hewitt (not Miss Heilig) as being absent. Also Ms. Dieli was appointed to Ways and Means Committee. Then, so noted, the motion carried.

Executive Reports

Chris Pelkey reported on Faculty Assembly: They are dealing now with Proficiency exams for introductory courses, interdisciplinary program advisement, residency requirement for graduates, early admissions (after 3 Years of High School), a new Philosophy major, and proposals for Fine Arts and Music Majors. She then answered questions pertaining to the Mediation Panel, and its members. Sen. Melech moved for Special Orders of the Day to bring Bills 129 and 123 (both vetoed) to the floor. (2nd-Sen. Seiden) It carried. Sen. Thompson moved to table Bill 129 indefinitely, (2nd-Mr. Brandte), and it carried. After discussion of Bill 133, a vote was taken sustaining the veto with 20-yes, 6-no, and 1 abs.. Then Sen. Thompson moved to reconsider (2nd-John), and after a lengthy debate, the veto was overridden with a vote of 26-yes, and 1-no. At 6:20 the Senate recessed, and reconvened at 7:10. Then, by a handvote the Senate decided to hold meeting on Wednesday next week.

Committee Reports

Student Affairs - no report (Sen. Kronenbitter Sprained her ankle)

Election Committee - Sen. Riebling reported that the elections are going fine.

Judiciary and Constitutional Revision They dealt with Bill 118, and it is in the packet.

Academic Affairs Sen. Harmony reported that the Library Council has not yet changed the book check-out system, and at this time, don't have the funds.

Internal Operations Sen. Harmony reported that the Parking Restrictions Bill was referred to Student Affairs for investigation.

Ways and Means Sen. Hann explained the minutes. Mr. Martin moved to approve the Finance Committee minutes (2nd-Jeff), and it carried.

New Business

Bill 118 Sen. Harmony sponsored the Bill, (2nd-Jeff), and Sen. Melech moved to table it (2nd-Ms. Charette), the motion carried.

Bill 142 Sen. Harmony sponsored the bill (2nd-Sen. Melech). Sen. Seiden moved to table for one week. (2nd-Ms. Charette). It carried.

Sen. Melech then called for Special Orders of the Day to bring Bills 143 and 145 to the floor, and it carried.

Bill 143 Sen. Harmony sponsored the Bill (2nd-Eric), and then friendly

amendment to section XV B reading: This will take effect on April 11.
So, amended the Bill carried unanimously, with 22-yes votes.

Bill 145 Sen. Harmony sponsored the bill (2nd-Sen. Riebling). Sen. Riebling proposed to amend the bill to add an allocation of \$20 to print ballads, (2nd-Sen. McCormack) to be taken from Operating Expenses, and to state that the voting will take place on April 9 and 10th. A handvote carried the amendment, and the Bill was passed as amended with 22-yes votes.

Sen. Harmony moved to adjourn (2nd-Eric), and the motion carried. The Senate stood adjourned at 7:40 p.m..
