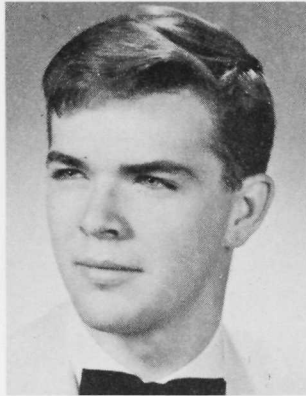

I am an independent candidate for the office of President of the Executive Board. My qualifications are as follows:

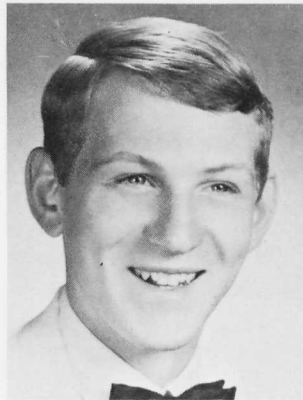

(College and Institute Student Government Association) Conference recently with representatives from other colleges, and was given the opportunity to discuss problems faced on other campuses and their solutions.

I am now hoping that you, the student body, will give me the chance to use the knowledge I have gained from the C.I.S.G.A. Conference and apply it to our own school. I have proposed an amendment to the Constitution to establish a permanent Senate Financial Committee. And through close contact with the present Executive Board, I have kept up to date with current campus problems.

Finally, being an independent with no political affiliation, I will be the students' President with their best interests in mind.

In my junior year at McQuaid, I was elected to the office of Vice-President of the Student Government and served in that capacity until I was graduated in June of 1966. In the summer of '65, between Junior and Senior year, I became one of the founding members of the "Teen-Age League for Responsible Citizens of Monroe County." I was a member of this organization and served as Chairman of the Public Relations Committee until January 1966. Presently, I am

I am running for the position of President for the Executive Board of the Student Association.

I attended East High School where I was active in student representation, have been Petty Officer in the United States Navy, social chairman for Sigma Beta Chi Fraternity, plus social chairman of various organizations. Also, I have been a music teacher at the Benson School of Music.

I am currently on the dean's list at Monroe Community. Also, I am a member of the MCC Chorus. I formerly attended MCC in 1964; and while I was here, I participated in the entertainment aspect of variety shows previously held here.

I have a great interest in student government; and if elected to the position of President of the Executive Board, I will do all I can to make the Student Government an effective voice of the entire student body. I am running for the position of President independently, with no party backing.

Inter-Greek Platform

1) THE ADOPTION OF A STUDENT ADVISORY COUNCIL

This council would act in an advisory capacity to the president and would be concerned with administrative problems affecting students. Those who would be representing the students would be the President of the Student Association, Sophomore and Freshmen Senates, Fraternities and Sororities, Clubs and Organizations, the Editor of the Newspaper and five representatives from each class.

2) THE REGULATION OF THE STUDENT UNION OR STUDENT LOUNGE

The Student Union Building at our new campus will be the hub of social activity for Community students next year. Thus, it is imperative that a feasible program be worked out for the handlings of the Union. These would include (a) A P.A. system to inform students on the activities of the Student Government and also inform the students of weekend social functions; (b) Big-name entertainment - Since we will have the facilities for presenting top-named stars (our Student Union would be used for such functions as weekends, etc.) and an increased budget, it is very conceivable that we can present some of the best entertainment possible.

3) THE FORMATION OF INTER-SCHOOL RELATIONS

Relations between local colleges should be begun on some level. It has been suggested that a social function could be held with three or possibly four area colleges involved.

4) A CRITICAL LOOK AT OUR PRESENT GRADING SYSTEM

On this point, we would appreciate any and all opinions from the students themselves regarding a revision of our present grading. Illustrated, this plan would be: A = 4.0, B+ = 3.5, B = 3.0, C+ = 2.5, C = 2, D+ = 1.5, D = 1.

5) AN INCREASED PROGRAM OF STUDENT CONVOCATIONS

A program for more convocations should be worked out for the coming year. These would include both professional and amateur talent, musical programs, movies, speakers and various activity programs. We are sure that everyone appreciated the appearance of the "Road-runners" here at MCC, and we feel many

more entertaining and instructive functions can be held here next year.

6) CLUB REPRESENTATION ON S.G.A. We would like to put into effect a plan whereby organizations may appoint a representative to a post of "ex-officio" members of the Student Government Association with a non-voting power. They would represent their respective organizations at Student Senate meetings and also at Executive Board meetings. This would mean increased representation for the students because they will have chosen their representatives.

Independents' Platform

1) Fill the gap between the students and faculty here at MCC.

2) Ensure communication between the Student Government itself and the student body. The entire student body must know what its government is doing for them.

3) Play an active role in the S.G.A. to the best of my ability.

4) Ensure proper representation for each and every student.

5) To make absolutely certain that the students' suggestions are most carefully thought about and acted upon.

1) Open Greater Channels of Dialogue between Administration and Students and Faculty and Students. This also includes the promotion and establishment of the new Student Welfare Committee and direct representation on some of the existing faculty committees.

2) Effective Student Representation on Academic Standards Committee.

3) Call for a Constitutional Convention to meet over the summer.

4) Provide opportunity for a student voice in the planning of new study areas and library facilities.

5) Investigate cafeteria to see if there is an unreasonable amount profit being realized from the sale of food.

S.F.C.A. Platform

Our new campus is far behind schedule, and it appears more and more likely that full use of the new campus will not be possible until at least January and perhaps next September. All will be concerned to know that next year we will accommodate 3,000 students in the same building now serving 2,200. Therefore, let it be known that the Students For College Action is aware of the

current situation and is advocating realistic goals that are to be accomplished before we occupy the new site.

1) HOW MANY CUTS? - A thorough investigation of the current class attendance policy with implementation of the recommended changes. The current policy is at least ambiguous. We are told that each professor may devise his own system. In a memo from Dean Smith's office, however, point 1 reads: "Prompt and regular attendance at all class and laboratory sessions is required."

2) MORE CHRISTMAS RIOTS? - Increased student membership in the school Calendar Committee would be more likely to develop a schedule of vacations, exams, etc., suitable to STUDENTS as well as faculty and administration.

3) FINALLY A STUDENT UNION - It is possible that full use of the new campus facilities will not be possible for more than a year. Jamestown Community College was challenged by a one-building campus similar to our own. But students there led a drive that culminated in an exceptionally nice off-campus Student Union. The S.F.C.A. will use all of its influence to achieve a similar goal.

4) CONSTITUTIONAL REFORMS - Each year for the past several years every Executive Board has promised sweeping changes in our out-dated and ineffectual constitution. (It is longer than the United States Constitution.) Upon election we will put into effect a temporary committee to work all year until the constitution is thoroughly updated.

5) AID FOR SENATE - The Senate is in danger of disintegration due to the fact that the Executive Board has virtually taken over its primary function. Senate authority to act as principal legislative organ must be restored.

6) BOOST TO STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS - Elimination of the minimum membership clause for creation of student groups that must be officially sanctioned. All new organizations would be allowed one month to draft a permanent charter. In the meantime, it could legally function with a brief statement of purpose submitted to the Executive Board and the Dean of Student Activities.

7) STUDENT PROTECTION - Plans for all social events planned by student groups must be submitted to the Executive Board two weeks prior to the event. This would do much to protect student organizations from any legal action that might occur.

Mike Cole, Inter-Greek Vice-President

My name is Mike Cole and I would like to become Vice-President of the Executive Board. I feel that I am qualified because of past experience in student government. I am running on the Inter-Greek ticket.

I feel that student government should and must be a major part of any educational system. My main goal is to have more participation and involvement on the students' part which will result in a more effective and representative student government.

I won't make any wild campaign promises. I won't promise that if I am elected the students will take over the school; this would be impossible as well as impractical. If elected to the office I have chosen, I will be in contact with various committees. I will inform the student body as to what these committees are doing, and ask for any suggestions or complaints.
