1. Thanks to Mike and Celeste for a great job on elections.
2. Miss-a-Meal - we are voting next week. Presentations this week:

a. Make-A-Wish Foundation (Local)

- only available for children with terminal diseases (50% chance of reaching thier 18th birthday)
- all money to grant wishes is raised by foundation no government donations.
- 1985 - started by board members contributing to tackle first wishes, now nearing the 300th wish granted.
- Wishes come in four varieties: to be someone, to go somewhere, to have something, and to meet someone
- Doctors determine eligibility - we do not solicit.
- approximently \$35,000 per wish.

b. Special Olympics (Local)

- April 24th at SUNY Oswego - SO swim meet
- approximately 100 swimmers participate.
- Overwhelming support - sororities, adopt a grandparent, local buses, community services.
- Can only be positive
- Planning t-shirts, banner, staging, escorts, decoration, metals, jobs - need is \$15,000
- Invitation to volunteer.
- Last year primarily run on Miss-A-Meal donations.

c. Pennies for Penfield

- the money would go to purchase books for Penfield library due to budget cuts
- 4,280 in last year and a half
- Miss-A-Meal is a major source of funds

Garrow- Are we going to support students unconditionally?

Steenhuis- This is ridiculous.

Marquis- They signed the contract with Res Life, and broke it.

Celeste- I believe it was entrapment. The way they went about it disturbed the life of the student- the undercover moved in with him. Not all of the students live on campus.

- Kuryla- As far as this resolution, I do not support these students. We provide legal assistance, that's all the support we should give. They have to pay the price.
- Ensico- There are rules of conduct for students and we have to take this seriously. If you want to sting a rapist- do that. They broke the rules.
- Dean- Rape is another issue. We have a rule, there is a law. Wouldn't you want a rapist off-campus? They are facing the conduct committee, do we have confidence in justice? I feel badly for them, but we don't know exactly what happened, and we don't want to be a institution for drugs.
- Garrow- The dean brought up an important point, do we set a precedent?
- Dunlap- If something is illegal, we take our own chances.

Point of info- Crimes occurred on campus, but if they occurred off-campus, violations that adversely affect the college community is reason for student to be charged. Must meet a test of adversity, and go before a judiciary body.

Steenhuis- Every right if it harms the interests of students. I know people who've abused wimyn who still live here and yet marijuana users are expelled, this isn't fair.
Marquis- The only reason this is allegedly is because of how the justice system works. If it was something other than dope, it wouldn't matter to us. This is a fair minded policy. It isn't broken, it works fine.
Lerman- It leaves it open to the people in charge. I think it needs to be more defined.
Dean- I don't think I am in disagreement with what is in the bill. I think that the way the campus responds there is an emphasis on trafficking. The efforts to deal with drugs has a different enforcement. I think we can't condone it. Never expulsion. It's only an interim suspension.
Dunlap- I'd be angrier outside of campus if there was a rape, than drug use...I think there should be degrees.

- Garrow- Hoopla in my hall. I've seen drugs do bad things, and I do not support this bill. But defending the opposite side of what you believe in...does help you learn.

- Dean- They can call an interim suspension until the hearing.

- Popoff- All laws are made on moral judgments. The majority has zero tolerance for drugs.

- Marquis- I agree with what she said. In many social settings, where do we draw the line. This rule is reasonable. Vote it down and get it out of here.

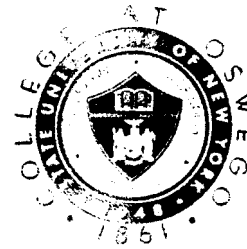

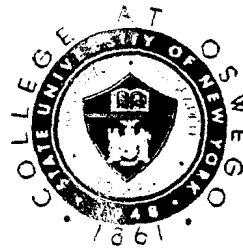
