HANYA HOLM

Once a member of the original Mary Wigman dance group which made history in the early 1920's. In 1931 she came to the U.S.A. and shortly evolved her own style and technique in a more American idiom. In addition to her many concert dances she has choreographed extensively for the theater. Her best known works include "Kiss Me Kate", "The Golden Apple", and the incomparable "My Fair Lady".

Besides her great gifts as a choreographer she is also known as an exceptional teacher with a sound educational philosophy which has been instrumental in the establishment of modern dance courses in all leading highschools and colleges in the U.S.

She is presently Director of the Summer School for the Dance at Colorado College, Colorado Springs.

ABOUT BROCKPORT COLLEGE AND ITS DANCE DEPARTMENT:

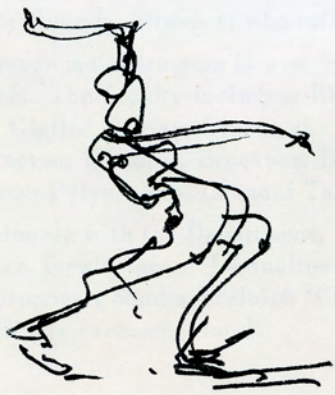

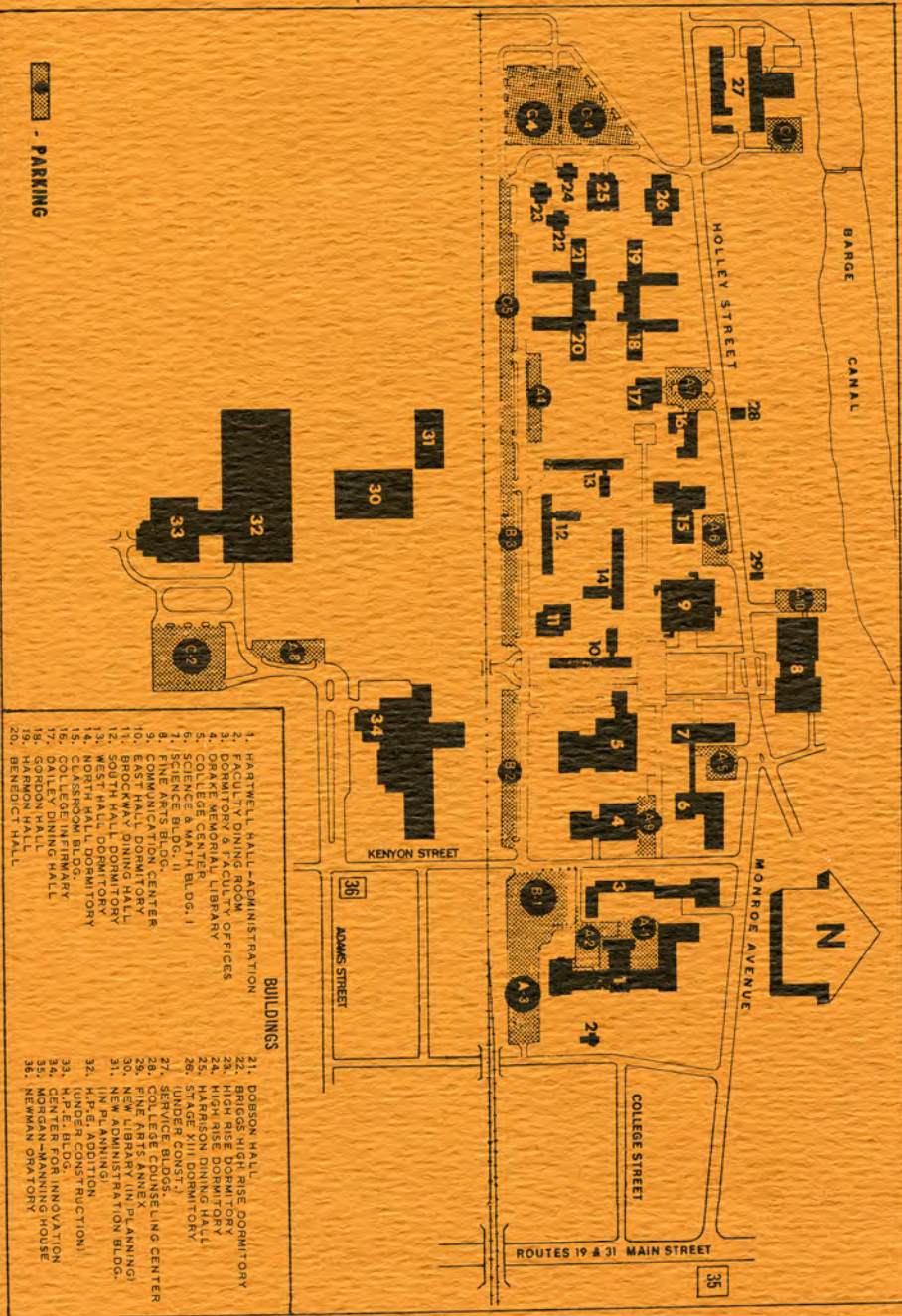
