Proposed Policy of College Entrance Examinations

It is proposed by the Operations Area that the State University College at Brockport accept satisfactory scores in each of the 5 basic liberal arts areas* of the General Tests of CLEP as completing the core requirement in the core area corresponding to that area; and that college credit equal to the amount required in that core area be given (to the veterans.) This shall be available for those (students, veterans) accepted by the Faculty Committee on Admissions who present evidence of satisfactory ** scores on the General Tests of CLEP or General Educational Development Tests at the time they matriculate provided the testing date is prior to matriculation date.

PROPOSED POLICY:

*The 5 basic liberal arts areas covered are:

1. English Composition
2. Humanities
3. Mathematics
4. Natural Science
5. Social Sciences - History

**For the purpose of interpretation, satisfactory scores on these tests shall be scores earned which correspond to the 50th percentile taking into consideration the standard error of measurement. The source of the 50th percentile may be national or local norms.
