The new degree-granting program in X-Ray Technology has been approved by the State University of New York Board of Trustees, and so X-Ray Technology will immediately be taught as a two-year curriculum at the college, leading to an Associate in Applied Science degree.

This is a pilot program in New York State and is being conducted here with the cooperation and support of the local chapter of X-ray technologists association and the college committee of the local hospitals.
