An invitation to President and Mrs. Tyrrell from Ambassador James Wadsworth to meet with the United States' Staff of the United Nations has been accepted for November 3 and 4.

President Tyrrell has been asked to participate on a panel at a Symposium to be held October 17, 18, in Washington with the Air Force Educational Requirements Board.

A meeting of SUNY Administrative Unit Heads will be held in Albany, Nov. 5 and 6.

Dean McVean and President Tyrrell will attend a meeting in Albany on November 1 and 2 regarding the Nursing Program.

The seventh annual conference of the Boards of Trustees of Community Colleges and Institutes of the State University of New York was held this year at Cooperstown on October 8 - 10. Our trustees in attendance were Miss Linda Stanford, Darwin R. Wales, Bernard H. Chernin, Robert F. Kelly, J. Bruce Buckler and Dr. James T. Ivory. Messrs. Tyrrell and McVean also attended.

Dean McVean will attend the first meeting of the Deans of State University's Agricultural and Technical Institutes and Community Colleges to be held Thursday and Friday, October 27 and 28 at Stony Kill, New York.

On October 20, Gordon Dates plans to attend the second meeting of the State Summer Conference committee to be held in Auburn.

Mr. Elliott will be a participant in a panel discussion at a seminar to be held in Binghamton, October 15, on the subject, "Labor Looks at the Problems of the Aging". The conference will be sponsored by New York State Federation of Labor and the New York State School of Industrial and Labor Relations at Cornell University. The planned seminar has been set up for delegates from Broome, Tioga, Chemung, and Steuben counties. Sessions will be held from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m. at the Arlington Hotel. Speakers will include experts on Social Security from Washington, D. C. and professors from Cornell University.
