Group3

SUNYConnect LMS implementations for the Group3 campuses are set to begin in August. The Group3 campuses are Canton, Delhi, Jefferson, Oneonta, Orange, Potsdam, Purchase, Rockland, Stony Brook HSC, Sullivan and Ulster. With the exception of Stony Brook HSC, these library systems will be hosted at ITEC.

ALEPH Training/Templates

SUNY OLIS is getting more and more in place to [assist with ALEPH implementation](#) and configuration. This includes ALEPH indexing, web opac files, other configuration files, conversion/data analysis services and SUNY-designed ALEPH training and workshops. These components are designed to get the campuses to a place with the ALEPH configuration that allows them to focus on other implementation tasks such as test database analysis, and in-house ALEPH training.

SFX

The SUNYConnect Advisory Council (S.A.C.) has proposed a [pilot implementation of the SFX](#) linking software. The pilot sites are Binghamton, Cobleskill and Fredonia.



Representatives from those campuses as well as from ITEC and OLIS received SFX training at the end of June. In addition, all other SUNY libraries have been asked to express their level of interest in implementing SFX. Fifty five SUNY libraries have indicated their interest in implementing the software. Document Delivery

Nylink has published a new Request for Proposals, soliciting proposals for SUNYConnect document delivery services. The plan is to have this service established during the third quarter of 2002. Eventually the service will be utilized to allow for SUNY library materials

to be borrowed efficiently between SUNYConnect campuses across New York State.
