What is Scholars Day?

The College at Brockport's Scholars Day was instituted in 1984 through the efforts of the College Senate. Scholars Day has continued as a celebration of scholarly pursuits by the campus community.

Scholars Day has several purposes:

- c) to expand knowledge
- d) to provide an opportunity to socialize with members of the campus community outside of one's own department.
